    - i. As we apply for the Grant are we considering the sustainability of the building? One of the issues on the building is the heating system, in order to keep it dry and warm for the prevention of mold, we should be looking at the most eco friendly heating system so that it can be kept on through the wet season.

ii. Are we updating the plan or are we just updating the cost projection? Its just 44 an update on the financing so that we can show capacity to accomplish the 45 goals set out in the Grant application. Our in-kind match is completing the 46 project, we are not liable for funds we do not receive and our out-of-pocket 47 costs should be minimal. 48 **Public Comment:** 49 i. John Johnston: Introduces members of his committee that are in the 50 audience. His organization has been raising funds to alleviate the cost of the 51 project, so far they have received approximately \$140,000 from 143 separate 52 community members for the grant match and the City Council previously 53 approved this project. They have been working on this project since 2019, 54 almost 5 years, but the Covid Crisis limited the activates they were able to 55 engage in. They are still accepting donations; you can do so by dropping 56 loose chance in donation houses around town or visiting their website; more 57 substantial donations are tax deductible. 58 Council asks if his organization is a 501(c) (3) - no. 59 d.
